A MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Dear Brother/Sister in Christ,

My hope, my prayer, my dream is that our St. John the Baptist & St. Joseph Catholic Collaborative would be a place where **everyone knows your name, because we know Him!** Regardless of where life's journey has taken you, **all are invited, all are welcome** to join us in discovering and rediscovering the immensity of the Father's love for us in Christ Jesus.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are called, healed, anointed and sent to be ambassadors for Christ; to be His witnesses in both word and deed. We acknowledge that we hold this treasure, this sacred gift of the divine life-AMAZING GRACE, in earthen vessels (fragile clay pots). In a world longing for peace, we have the privilege to offer our neighbor Jesus, the King of Peace, and share with them why He is "the reason for our hope".

We have the blessed opportunity to walk with people in the messiness and brokenness of life, and to invite them to join us at the Eucharistic banquet. As Pope Francis once said: "the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak." Jesus is the Bread of Life, who desires to feed, heal and transform "earthen vessels," enabling us to roll up our sleeves and go out to bear witness to the Good News!

The past year has given me the opportunity to get to know and understand the uniqueness of our parishes and to get to know more personally the heart of our community – our beloved parishioners. Many had expressed concern over the lack of young families, children and young adults participating in the life of our community. In **response to these concerns**, we hired Andrea Alberti as our Director of Evangelization and Outreach and her daughter Francesca as our Youth Minister this past summer. Under their leadership, we launched our **Summer of Fun** which included a Quincy Point Fire Pit (bring your burning question), a youth Carnival, CAMPS, Steubenville East, LIFT, a Hike and Mass on Blue Hills, Canobie Lake Park, Altar Server Training, the first Vacation Bible School in over 25 years, and so much more.

We have also made changes to our Religious Education program. Each month we host an event that **brings families and parishioners together for a fun, community-building experience**, helping us create a life-giving, joyful, Christ-centered community around our Collaborative. To assist in implementing a hybrid approach to Faith Formation we created a new position called Coordinator of Missionary Outreach and Evangelization and hired Jessica Colantonio to fill this role. Under her leadership we have great hopes of increasing family participation in our community, especially Sunday Eucharist.

This report is presented to you to let you know where we stand and where we would like to be. Exciting things are happening in our Collaborative! You are loved! You are called! You are anointed! And you are invited into this mission! Holy Spirit, lead the way!

Collaborative Financial Results

Dear Parishioner,

Our Saint John the Baptist and Saint Joseph Catholic Collaborative is made up of two unique parishes with one focus; our savior Jesus Christ. From a financial perspective it is important for you to know that both parishes maintain their own financial identity. All donations made to a parish remain within that parish and each parish is responsible for paying its own bills. Saint John the Baptist and Saint Joseph's have their own finance councils advising Fr. Matt keeping separate financial statements. On the next few pages of this document, you will see a summary of the recent financial results for both parishes of our collaborative as well as our plan for the current fiscal year.

Last year was challenging financially. Our fiscal year runs from July 1st to the following June 30th, so our most recent year ended on June 30, 2019. Offertory donations continued to decline at both parishes. Saint John's was able to post a modest profit, but significantly lower than the prior year as other revenues such as Gifts & Bequests and Religious Education also declined significantly. Going forward, we will need to implement a Grand Annual fundraiser at Saint John's in order to offset the impact of lower leasing revenues as the Town of Quincy moves parking to new lots in town. Saint Joseph Parish continues to rely on savings to support its day to day operations, and last year spent an additional \$75,000 to renovate the rectory which now serves as the collaborative offices. Without a significant increase in offertory donations going forward, Saint Joseph's will once again need to rely on savings to make ends meet. This will be the last year we will be able to do this.

So what is our plan to turn things around financially? With the help of the Holy Spirit, we are going to ignite our faith community in Quincy with the love of Jesus and fill the pews with believers. Led by our Pastor Father Matt, our Parochial Vicar Father Joseph and our Director of Evangelization & Outreach Andrea Alberti, great things are coming. Filled with the Holy Spirit it will be you, disciples of Jesus, inviting others to Mass and other activities and ministries in our Parishes that will bring NEW LIFE and create a domino effect of spiritual multiplication. It is your invitation, it is Christ in you that others will respond to. There is a world dying of anxiety, depression and meaningless living. How many of your friends and family need Jesus ... invite them here to our Parishes ... where everyone knows your name because we know **Him**.
